
Zuzana Šochová, the new generation of female IT representative, was elected to the Board of Directors of Scrum Alliance

Mr. Williams sees a dramatic shift, "Until recently, Czech developers were known for their low wages. Today, we can see that the quality of work here is as good as Silicon Valley, and

oftentimes better."

The influential blog HackerRank has found that Czechs are considered to be among the ten best in the world, while the USA is in 28th place.

Zuzana Šochová represents this shift of perceptions. A graduate of CVUT, she has worked and taught in the USA, Europe, and Asia. She estimates she's trained over 5,000 software professionals in Scrum development methodologies. Known for her rainbow colored hair, ready wit, and deep experience, her election to the Board of the Scrum Alliance is a welcome opportunity to show the world that the Czechs have achieved yet another important mile stone in the transition from authoritarianism to a free and open society.
